DIRECTOR OF YOUTH AND CHRISTIAN EDUCATION UPDATE

Dear Pilgrims,

We wanted to let you know about what's happening with our church school in light of Lisa Hulbert's announcement that she will be leaving us in June. A search committee has been formed to help find our next Director of Youth and Christian Education. We are thankful that Mike Clark (Chair), Elena Zorn, Beth Kurth, and Lisa Boehm are leading this effort with assistance from Rev. Lauren. Rev. Jill (who has a lot of experience in this area) will serve as a sounding board and will assist the committee as needed from July-September. We appreciate all of the feedback from Church School families and have relayed that information to the Search Committee to help guide their selection process.

That feedback is also being used by Lisa and Beth Kurth to plan for next year. As our outgoing Director, Lisa has been working with Beth to ensure that we will have our Church School programming up and running in the fall. Lisa has been helping with curriculum, the CE calendar, and teacher recruiting. Please note that Beth will serve as our Interim Director until our Search Committee feels that we have found the best fit for our congregation. When Rev. Lauren returns in October, she will continue to meet with our youth—some of whom were just confirmed in May.

We would ask for your patience and your prayers as it may take time to fill this vital staff position. Please help spread the word, and if you know of someone who may be interested in serving in this capacity, please encourage them to apply!

CHURCH COUNCIL CHANGES

There are some changes in our Pilgrim Church lay leadership to announce. Jeanne DeSanto has stepped down as our Moderator and has moved on from Pilgrim. Personally and on behalf of the entire congregation, I would like to thank Jeanne for all that she has done, and for the many ways she and Mike contributed to our community during their time with us. I wish Mike, Jeanne, and their family all the best on their journeys of faith.

Our former Moderator, Suzanne Abair, has agreed to serve as our Interim Moderator from June-September and will be available to help Rev. Jill Olds with the sabbatical coverage for our congregation. In the fall, Church Council will elect a new Moderator to fill the role from October-April, pending congregational approval.

Ruth Litchfield will be traveling with Communities Without Borders (CWB) again this summer, Pilgrim's seventh trip to support orphans and vulnerable children in communities outside Lusaka, the capitol of Zambia.

Many of you who have traveled with us and supported our mission there will remember stories of Nina in Ng'Ombe as well as all the work we did there and in Mandevu through Mrs. Teresa Banda including electricity, new latrine, new exterior fencing/wall to say nothing of the teaching done by travelers of the past and participation in their graduation ceremonies. Pilgrim has a great deal to be proud of in both of these communities. You have all helped hundreds of children through these years.

This summer Ruth will be traveling with CWB June 28th and returning on July 15th. She will be working and representing Pilgrim at the Garden Community and at a new school through CWB, Living Hope which is walking distance from out Guesthouse. She will be working/teaching in the schools and perhaps will be involved in teacher workshops while there. When the other travelers go south to Livingston Falls, she will happily stay back to have extra time with the Ng'Ombe and Mandevu communities of the past that they have worked with and supported so strongly. Ruth has been in touch with Nina on Ng'Ombe, and has learned that she has not been paid this entire school year. The Mission Committee has kindly committed fund to support her work there *and* Ruth will bring stories to you all upon her return. She will also spend time at Mandevu as well and Simon Kapeuta Middle School, also walking distance from the Guesthouse.


