The 2014-2015 program year has been a great learning experience for Educational and Youth ministries. We have been working hard to build on the foundation of programs that Pilgrim Congregational Church had prior to my arrival. We are excited to look towards next year.

In Church School we are going to transition from a traditional Church School model to a three-week rotation model. Children will be learning Bible stories through multiple, hands on techniques. Through cooking, art, drama, games and much more, our students will be able to learn in an environment suited for them. Our upper elementary and middle school students will also be working on a new program this coming year. This group will be working to put our faith in action by focusing much of their time on local mission and service projects. Our Mission Kids will explore Bible lessons and how they can be applied to serving and strengthening our community.

With these new initiatives we are looking to involve more members of the congregation in the Church School. Volunteers with many different talents and skills are needed to strengthen our programs. If you are interested in teaching a three week unit in any capacity please let me know. We are also in need of floating teachers for the upcoming year. This position is a three-week commitment designed to give an extra set of hands to the Church School teachers.


