On Sunday November 22 we will formally conclude this year's Stewardship Campaign. By then, you will have heard from Susan Carabbio, Doug Johnston, Susan Moffitt, and Emily Collins about why they pledge and what Pilgrim Church means to them. You will have heard about the good we already do and how with your financial support, we can be even stronger as God guides us to a future with hope.

Stewardship is about gratitude. Personally, when I'm feeling especially grateful I can't help but give more in all areas of my life. When one is grateful, it's like the gratitude starts overflowing. Gratitude is an important aspect of our faith, but it doesn't always come easily. M. Craig Barnes (President of Princeton Theological Seminary) writes about gratitude by saying that we have the capacity to choose to receive the life we've been given or to rebel and try to make a living all on our own. That an element of the Christian story going all the way back to the Garden of Eden is that we can't always have everything that we want! Even Jesus had to work within boundaries, entrusting his disciples with carrying his message out into the world. Jesus had to meet people where they were, help them discover their gifts and who God created them to be, and then send them to go out and do likewise if his message wasn't going to die with him.

Barnes reminds us that we are called to humility and receiving life from God with grateful hearts even though we can't always have everything that we want! Gratitude then becomes an active choice for us. He writes, "I'm not certain that there are such things as measures of our spirituality, but if there are, then gratitude is probably the best one. It indicates that we are paying attention."

Gratitude indicates that we're paying attention. When you come worship this November at Pilgrim Church or attend meetings or church events, I invite you to take a moment and truly pay attention:

- Pay attention to the people you encounter—old friends, new friends, young Pilgrims, and people you don't even know yet.
- Pay attention to the memories over the years that connected you to our church community and deepened your Christian faith.
- Pay attention to what you learn, to what moves you, and to how you will go forth and do something about it today.
- Pay attention to how you encounter God with us at Pilgrim Church, and pay attention to how God is guiding us to a future with hope.

When we pay attention and feel gratitude, we can't help but give with grateful hearts!

And if God has felt distant or even absent in our lives, perhaps these new understandings and images of God will open up new meanings to help ground us in God. 
