
# Pilgrim's Progress October 1, 2014 - Volume 56 Number 8



In May of 2014 there was an amazing time lapse video taken of an Amish Barn Raising. With almost 2 million views, you could say that the video has done pretty well! If you go to **YouTube** and type in **Ohio Amish Barn Raising May 13, 2014** you'll see this process in all its glory. For three minutes and thirty seconds, you see dozens of Amish men working diligently and precisely on building a new barn for a neighbor. In the Amish community, this happens quite often especially since Old Order Amish are adamant about restricting the use of technology, including heavy machinery

often needed by the rest of us to build a structure as large as a barn! This process has worked for the Amish for generations and one gets the sense that the times are not a changing as far as they are concerned! What an amazing commentary on our modern world though that a neighbor who is an "Englishman" (as the Amish would say) was able to film this remarkable process for the rest of us to watch and enjoy.

What's fascinating about the Barn Raising tradition is that people gather to help a neighbor build and there's the expectation that if all these folks gathered to help build your barn, you will be sure to show up and help at the next Barn Raising for another person in need. It's a community building endeavor as much as it's an engineering feat or an example of hard work or anything else. Sometimes there are Barn Raisings when there's been a fire or a tornado or other natural disaster destroyed a barn. And it's in those moments that the community gathering to quite literally help rebuild a family's livelihood takes on another level of poignancy.

Which brings me to our Pilgrim Congregational Church UCC version of an Amish Barn Raising--our annual **Pumpkin Patch!** This year we won't be building a crazy structure of pumpkins on the front lawn or anything like that, don't worry. But we will need the community to gather together to help one another and our church do something remarkable. The Pumpkin Patch isn't exactly easy work--from unloading the pumpkins on **Saturday October 11** to selling the pumpkins during the week and weekends to rolling the pumpkins to be sure they are still in good shape to telling your friends and neighbors to get some pumpkins from us, it takes a community coming together to make this work.

We had a Baptism this past Sunday and I pointed out that it takes a congregation to baptize a baby in the Christian faith. This is something that I truly believe and it's easy to see when we have a baptism at our church. Even our Holy Water comes from all of us! It also takes a congregation to offer a worship service, to do mission and justice work, to teach our children, youth, and adults, to learn, to grow, to care, to serve--I could go on and on! This Fall provides a wonderful opportunity for us to once again come together as a congregation, as a community of Christians, to do something remarkable. Hope to see you there!

# NEIGHBORS IN NEED SPECIAL MISSION OFFERING OF THE UCC--OCTOBER 5

Neighbors in Need (NIN) is a special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds of the offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries(JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants.

Neighbors in Need grants are awarded to churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities. These grants fund projects whose work ranges from direct service to community organizing and advocacy to address systemic injustice. Funding is provided through donations to the Neighbors in Need offering. The 2014 theme

for NIN is "Imagining Another World Where Literacy is No Longer a Concern" and connects to the "Reading Changes Lives" justice advocacy initiative of the UCC.

We will receive the NIN offering on October 5, 2014 as part of our World Communion Sunday observance.

Rev. Lauren has been accepted into a leadership program in the United Church of Christ! The Next Generation Leadership Initiative (NGLI) is a program with the United Church of Christ Pension Boards and is a ten year commitment and opportunity for Lauren to learn, grow, and bring her new knowledge back to Pilgrim! She is part of a cohort of fifteen colleagues (the NGLI Class of 2025) who are ordained UCC ministers in their 20s and 30s serving in churches throughout the United States. Lauren is the only minister from Massachusetts in her class. The program is intended to provide advanced training for select ministers to help hone gifts and skills in order to become transformational leaders and will include training in: Family Systems Theory, Adaptive Leadership, Personal Leadership Styles, Communication Systems, Team Building, and Natural Church Development.

The first four years of the program will be more direct programming and the remaining six years will be working on an independent project. Thus far, there are 75 UCC ministers in their 20s and 30s throughout the nation who are part of the Next Generation Leadership Initiative--the Class of 2021-the Class of 2025. Lauren participated in Orientation at the Church House in Cleveland in August and will be spending a week with her NGLI Class learning Family Systems Theory in January. Congratulations!
