Grade 4/5: Ms. Lesley Morrison


This fall, we have many special services and opportunities planned for all families:

PILGRIM'S NEW WEBSITE – SAVE THE DATE FOR SEPTEMBER 29!

After months of research, interviews and benchmarking, Church Council has approved the construction of a new church website in partnership with Theory One Design, a leader in creating modern, easy-to-navigate websites for faith-based organizations. Theory One Design (TOD) is a local design firm with a national reputation. They have worked with not-for-profit organizations like Harvard University, Children's Hospital Boston, Cradles to Crayons, and MIT. They are also a leader in designing websites for faith-based organizations of all sizes with past clients including Old South Church in Boston and First Church in Cambridge. While completion of the new site is not expected until the spring of 2014, our work has already begun! We have assembled a Website Committee including Suzanne Abair, Bob Beckwith, Jeff Boehm, Milan Chytil, Jeanne DeSanto and Rev. Lauren Lorincz. During the summer, a smaller working group began the task of assembling an inventory of pages and organizing existing material that can either be re-used or re-purposed on the new website.

Throughout September and October, our efforts will become more visible as we undertake the first phase of the project called "*The Discovery Phase*:". During this time, TOD will immerse themselves in both who we are as a church today and what our goals and aspirations are for tomorrow. A professional photographer and representatives from TOD will visit and photograph our church. Their goal will be to capture - in both images and text - Pilgrim's unique personality, character and spirit.

But none of this can happen without your help. Great websites are built not by many pages but with many voices. We need all of you (members

and friends alike) to come and share your thoughts, feelings, hopes and aspirations for Pilgrim. In that spirit, so that all voices may be heard, we encourage you to attend our mission statement ideation session called *Pilgrim: The Past, The Present and The Promise* immediately following worship on **Sunday, September 29th**. Lunch will be served and childcare will be provided. We expect the session to run for no longer than 90 minutes.


THE PUMPKINS ARE COMING, THE PUMPKINS ARE COMING...

HONDURAS HAPPENINGS

This summer our family hosted two children from Honduras, 11 year old Noel and 8 year old Astrid. There is a great deal of coordination and efforts made by many people to allow these children to receive their ongoing medical care.

The first step is arranging their medical appointments with Tufts Medical Center in Boston and Shriners Hospital for Children in Springfield. For the past 7 years, The Ray Tye Medical Aid Foundation has generously provided financial support which paid for Noel's open heart surgery and all the follow up care and evaluations. He is currently living without a valve and is closely monitored for change in symptoms which would indicate the need for another operation. Astrid has been receiving free care from Shriners Hospital since she was 2 years old. She was born with "lipomenigocele" which is a condition involving the spinal cord that required an operation to resect and detether it. She has also been operated on multiple times on her left "cavus" foot. This summer, she was suffering from pain on the dorsom of her right foot and was fit for an "ankle-foot orthosis" (brace) which she will need to wear every day, and it is recommended she be seen in 6 months.

We're thankful for the ongoing support from Pilgrim Church and Nancy and Charlie Morrison of Concord, MA. They paid for the airline tickets to make this trip possible and volunteers from American Airlines Ambassador Program who escorted the children from Honduras to Boston. Lastly, to all our family and friends who have welcomed Noel and Astrid into your own lives, we are forever grateful for your love, involvement and support.

A NEW WALKWAY

One of the results of the annual visit of the Lexington Building Inspector last year was the information that the handicapped access ramp leading to the entrance of Pilgrim Hall no longer meets the code requirements. Among other problems, the height differential between the landing and the door jamb is too great for a wheelchair to navigate readily. By law we must meet these requirements.

Many possible solutions were discussed and found wanting. Eventually, it became clear that the old ramp needed to be replaced. But instead of another ramp, larger and with taller side rails, we are going to have a curving sidewalk instead! The walkway will begin next to the lower end of the main sidewalk, then curve around in front of the small maple tree near the Sun Room, and eventually end at a landing in front of the doors to Pilgrim Hall. Because the slope will be very gradual, hand rails will not be required.

The walkway will be more attractive and less expensive than a new ramp would be--a win-win solution to a sticky problem. Plans are in the works to have construction begin this summer.
