
Pilgrim's Progress September 2, 2014 - Volume 56 Number 7


- The Poor in Spirit—October 1

September 14 - Choir 9:30am; No Handbell rehearsal - Church BBQ after worship


September 21 - Handbell Rehearsal resumes!!! - 11:45-12:15 in the Balcony. (So we don't have to set up and tear down every Sunday!)

have provided this summer has been very much appreciated by all who attended. Thank you!




