PRAYER OF CONFESSION

- ONE: Ash Wednesday provides us with the gift of time and space for repentance. Let us prepare our hearts for the season of Lent by confessing our sins.
- ALL: Righteous God, we join with worshipers all over the globe, uniting in our collective agreement that we desire to be more like you—more loving, more compassionate, more generous, more just, more patient, more faithful.
 - And as we focus our gaze upon your perfection, we cannot help but witness the ways in which we fail to live according to that standard, both individually and collectively. We have failed on a global scale, perpetuating systems that damage whole groups of people, whole species of creation, and whole generations of children.
- ONE: We have failed on an individual scale in ways only we know in our minds and hearts.
- ALL: So, we confess these sins with full conviction that you bear our sins with compassion and completion. And when we confess our sins, we find liberation from the chains binding us. We pray these things in the name of the one who delivers us from sin. Amen.

ASSURANCE OF PARDON

IMPOSITION OF ASHES

The congregation is invited to receive the imposition of ashes, a reminder of our mortality and the eternal nature of God. If you are at home, you may use a bit of soil for this purpose. "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return, but the steadfast love of God endures forever."

A LITANY OF FORGIVENESS AND COMMITMENT

ALL: We acknowledge and confess our sins of thought, word and deed, and we humbly seek God's forgiveness.

ONE: God hears the confession of our heart and lips.

Through Jesus Christ we are forgiven all our sins, and by the power of the Holy Spirit we are empowered for new life.

ALL: We believe in the good news of Jesus Christ.

From this moment forward we commit to walking in the ways of God's love, peace and justice.

ONE: God's peace be with you.
