We receive them today, just as we receive a call to confession and repentance.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION

ONE: Ash Wednesday provides us with the gift of time and space for repentance. Let us prepare our hearts for the season of Lent by confessing our sins.

ALL: Righteous God, we join with worshipers all over the globe, uniting in our collective agreement that we desire to be more like you—more loving, more compassionate, more generous, more just, more patient, more faithful.

And as we focus our gaze upon your perfection, we cannot help but witness the ways in which we fail to live according to that standard, both individually and collectively. We have failed on a global scale, perpetuating systems that damage whole groups of people, whole species of creation, and whole generations of children.

ONE: We have failed on an individual scale in ways only we know in our minds and hearts.

ALL: So, we confess these sins with full conviction that you bear our sins with compassion and completion. And when we confess our sins, we find liberation from the chains binding us. We pray these things in the name of the one who delivers us from sin. Amen.

ALL: We believe in the good news of Jesus Christ. From this moment forward we commit to walking in the ways of God's love, peace and justice.

ONE: God's peace be with you.




