





*Our Easter offering will support the United Church of Christ's Middle East appeal. Funds* will support humanitarian relief desperately needed in this time: "immediate and longerterm responses such as food and nutrition needs, physical and psychosocial health care, shelter and rehabilitation, and direct assistance." "The work of our partners in Palestine, and specifically in Gaza, is inspiring, especially as they cope with conditions and access that are extremely limited.
