

SCRIPTURE READING James 3:5b-18

NOTICE of Meeting September 29, 2024

To all Pilgrim Church Members and Friends,

Pursuant to our Bylaws, you are invited to a Special Meeting of the congregation on Sunday, September 29 at 11:30 am or earlier, after the Worship Service.

Agenda:

The following changes to administration of the Beckwith Fund ("Fund") were requested by the only living children of Ellison F. Beckwith, the original donor of the Fund, to more accurately reflect their father's intent to support Pilgrim Congregational Church ("Church"). These changes were approved by the Church Council on May 21, 2024, and the Council now seeks Congregational approval.

Specifically, the Fund is proposed to be administered as follows:

- 1. The principal portion of the Fund, currently named the Beckwith (Principal) Fund, be classified as a Long-Term Investment as that term is defined in the Long-Term Investment Policy of Pilgrim Congregational Church as approved by Church Council on March 21, 2011;
- 2. All dividends and interest generated by the Beckwith (Principal) Fund shall be transferred to the Beckwith (Income) Fund on a monthly basis;
- 3. At the end of every calendar year, the current valuation of the Beckwith (Principal) Fund will be compared to a starting balance of \$500,000. If the end-of-year valuation exceeds \$500,000, 25% of the difference is to be transferred to the Beckwith (Income) Fund;
- 4. The Beckwith (Income) Fund's primary focus is the Church music program. To that end, the priority for spending shall be the music budget as developed by the Worship Committee in consultation with the Director of Music. Said budget would be used to cover items including, but not limited to, guest performers, tuning and repair of the organ and pianos, sheet music, licensing fees, and equipment such as music stands, instruments, and piano benches;
- 5. At the end of the program year (August 30), if there is money in the Beckwith (Income) Fund after accounting for the music budget, the remaining money could be used for any purpose approved by the Church Council;
- 6. These administrative processes will take effect retroactive to December 31, 2023; and
- 7. According to Ellison Beckwith's original request, in the event that the Church should be dissolved or liquidated, or the Church for any reason is unable to make use of the Beckwith Fund, the principal and the unexpended income and interest shall be given to the Andover-Newton Seminary at Yale Divinity School, New Haven, Connecticut. If Andover-Newton is not operating as a theological seminary, then all proceeds, income, and interest shall go to a Protestant theological educational institution selected by the Church.

Any other pertinent matters that may arise. Everyone is invited to attend; only members may vote. Council expects this will be a very brief meeting. Childcare will be provided.
