INVITATION TO COMMUNION

PRAYER OF ACCOUNTABILITY

ALL: God of Mercy, God of Love, you have given us the gift of being part of all creation. And yet we confess we have not treated your gift as you have taught us,

with gratitude and reciprocity.

Instead, we have taken more than we have given, we have hoarded what we do not need, we have viewed our fellow humans as competition rather than collaborators.

We have prioritized scarcity in the face of your abundance.

We have not looked at the lilies and at the birds.

Instead, we have worried about our own singular tomorrows more than we have worried about each other and what our neighbor might need today.

We have sought individual survival over communal solidarity.

We have not loved one another as you have loved us.

Today, God, we seek to be accountable to ourselves, to one another and to you.

We ask for your forgiveness,

and we think of those in our lives from whom we need to ask forgiveness.

We think of all the elements of your creation we have taken for granted, and we ask their forgiveness.

Cleanse us from the illusion of separateness and scarcity so we may rejoice and redistribute all your gifts.

ASSURANCE OF LOVE

ONE: God hears your prayers, as God hears all the cries of God's beloved creatures, from the chirps of the robin to the red maples who talk to one another underground.

ALL: Through God's grace and forgiveness, we compost our harms to generate new life and new love. Through God's love, we add our voices to the chorus of all creation as we pray together:

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father (Creator), who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kin-dom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, for thine is the kin-dom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.

PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING




